The carolers are planning to sing at the Council Party at St. Mary's Parish Hall on the 9th of December and at the Rosary Group Christmas Party on Christmas Day.

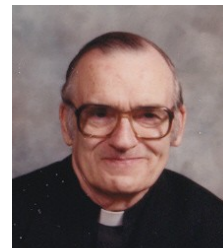

Chaplain's Message

Speaking personally, I have always been a bit of a history buff and because the year 2007 is such an Historic Year in the history of our illustrious order, I thought that I would share a few important dates with you.

-- **March 29, 1882:** The Knights of Columbus are founded by Reverend Michael J. McGivney at St. Mary's Parish in New Haven, Connecticut - 125 years ago.

-- **November 25, 1897:** The First Canadian Council of the Knights of Columbus, Council 284, was established at Saint Patrick's Parish in Montreal, Quebec, 110 years ago.

-- **March 4, 1906:** The first council of the Knights of Columbus in Western Canada, Council 1081, was established in Vancouver, B.C.

-- **June 17, 1907:** The first council of the Knights of Columbus in Saskatchewan was established - in Regina, Council 1247 - with Judge Reginald Rimmer as the Charter Grand Knight. The first meeting of Council 1247 took place right here in our Parish at Gratton Catholic School on the 1800 block of Cornwall Street

The Knights of Columbus are dedicated to the four pillars of Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism.


