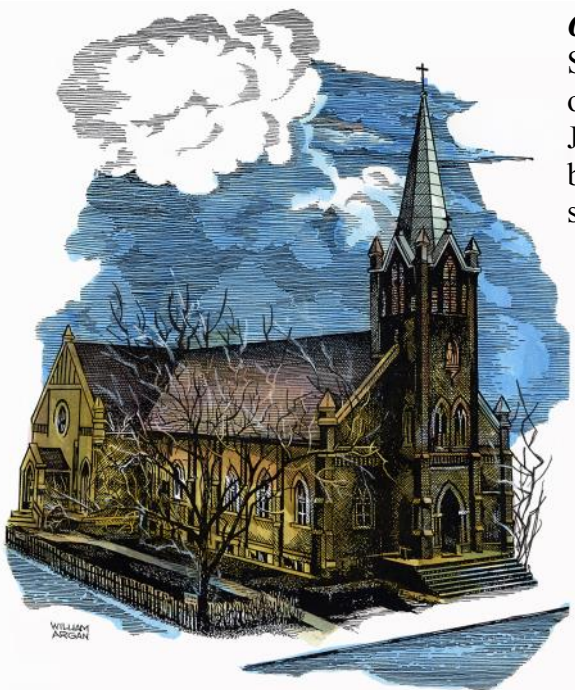

III. Living as a Steward

FOR REFLECTION & DISCUSSION

1. If you were to undertake stewardship as a way of Christian life, what major problems and pain would you anticipate?
2. In your lifetime, how have you experienced co-creation with God?
3. How do you relate Christian stewardship to ecology, to your personal care for the environment?
4. How do you react to the idea of “being our brother’s keeper,” of being involved in efforts to curtail consumerism so that God’s good things will benefit not only some but all people?
5. Do you see the theological connection between stewardship and “priestly mediation”?
6. What does the word of God say to you regarding the life of stewardship?

You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house. Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father. (Mt 5:13-16)

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. (1 Cor 12:4-6)
