


Church Renovations September 13th to December 2015



As you are probably aware, after the Sunday Mass on September 13th we will be closing the doors of Blessed Sacrament for about 2 ½ months in order to complete several very important repairs, renovations and upgrades to our 110-year-old building. Blessed Sacrament is the oldest Roman Catholic Church building in Regina, and the city's second oldest church still in use. In service to our Lord Jesus Christ, and in gratitude to the earliest Roman Catholics who gave it to us, it is our happy duty to pass this building on, in excellent condition, to the parishioners who will follow us. Information about weekly Saturday & Sunday Masses at St. Mary's is in this week's bulletin – please read it carefully.

Some of the work has already begun with the installation of a new organ two years ago and a new boiler and heating plant last fall, and will continue with repairs to the roof and bell tower, windows, the floor, including the addition of a new subfloor, improvements to the air flow and ventilation and removal of old building materials that have long passed their life expectancy. But in addition to these structural repairs and upgrades we will be restoring and redecorating the church so that it looks fresh and new, while at the same time respects the historical look and tradition that has been in place for many decades.

These renovations will include a new floor throughout the nave of the church as well as new carpeting at the front altar and side altars. The beautiful stain glass windows for which our church is well known in the community will have new protective glass on the exterior that will put the stain glass on display to the public as well as protect it for many to years to come. A reconstruction at the back of the church on the south side will see a new washroom and children's room, also known as a crying room, added to our building, that will retain the facades from the confessional to preserve the original appearance as much as possible. Improved lighting and ceiling fans, are examples of modern improvements while the communion rail across the altar, although a little rickety in places, will be restored and strengthened, again to maintain the decades old look and traditions of Blessed Sacrament.



Last week we gave you information about the new flooring to be installed throughout the nave and the sanctuary. This week we are providing a description of the new washroom and children's room. The existing confessional in the south west corner of the church will be dismantled, and as much as possible, the facing and original carpentry will be used in the new construction. The area will consist of a new washroom that includes a diaper changer space, and a children's crying room measuring approximately 13'x8'. That room will include both seating and standing room. An 8' glass window will close that room but still display the stained glass behind it. Entrance to the room will be through two oak doors, one solid and one with glass. This will be a welcome addition to our church as demographically we are seeing our congregation include more families with young children. These renovations will preserve the traditional beauty of Blessed Sacrament.

Please continue to pray for Blessed Sacrament parish, and for safety and progress for the work on our building. Please continue to support our parish with your attendance at St Mary's in the interim and by returning to see the "new improved" Blessed Sacrament for the Dec. 5th weekend masses provided everything proceeds on schedule.
