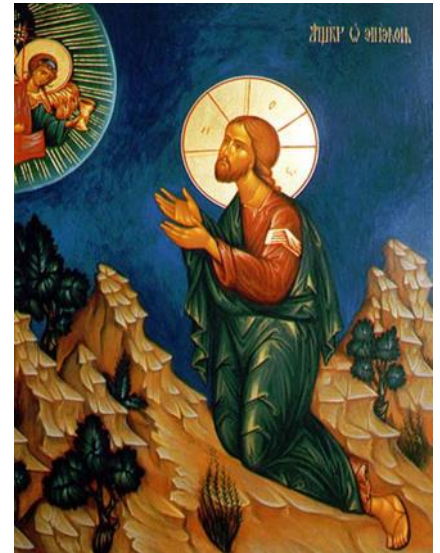

## Blessed Sacrament Church Renovation Update 3.0

**Church Washroom & Children’s Room Project:** Breda Brother Builders have completed their construction of the new washroom and children’s room in the South-West corner of the church adjacent to the main entrance. The blinds and curtains will be installed when the church floor replacement project resumes and the new floor tiles are installed in 2016. The new washroom and children’s room project has revealed several long-standing structural issues with the bell tower and the adjacent south-west church roof. These structural issues can no longer be ignored for the simple fact that structural failures cause harm to people!

In the first case, contractors needed to install new vents through the choir loft, attic and the church roof directly above the new washroom. We discovered that the south-west wall had separated away from the choir loft floor by as much as 4 inches. Further investigation revealed that three roof trusses on the south side of the bell tower are broken; the supporting roof beam directly above the washroom is giving way; the roof against the bell tower has dropped about 6 inches, all this causing the south-west washroom wall to push away from the choir loft floor. In late October, the Breda Brothers removed the stained glass window so it would not be lost in the event of a total bell tower failure. They also installed exterior wall braces to prevent the wall from capitulating.

In the second case, the Breda Brothers discovered three more signs of major structural failure in the bell tower. All of these pointed toward an imminent collapse of the tower in a south easterly direction. Jordan Asbestos removal were immediately called back on site to remove 110 years of “bird stuff” that had accumulated in the bell tower and choir loft ceiling. It took Jordan a full week in hazmat gear to clean up the tower, so that contractors could work safely to remove the bells. The Breda Brothers and subcontractors, safely removed three tower bells weighing about 4000 lbs in total on October 30, 2015. The bells are currently stored inside the rectory garage.



The south-west church roof, the south washroom window and wall, as well as the bell tower have been stabilized. Gerry Spooner and Fr. Barry have met with staff from Knox Metropolitan church to see how they have engineered a structural solution for their bell tower. A BBK Structural Engineer will be on site this week, December 1, 2015 to assess the structural issues with Blessed Sacrament’s bell tower. BBK will be asked to provide the engineering specs to install four new steel beams inside the four corners of the bell tower. These four steel beams are intended to form a new “structural cage” which will keep the bell tower from leaning, as well as support the weight of the three bells. The bell tower and roof will also need to be opened up to repair the building damage.

From a timing perspective, the first priority is to underpin the church floor so that the floor replacement project can be completed as soon as possible. Once these two projects are completed we can move back into the building and resume weekend Masses. The second priority is repair the damage to the church roof and bell tower. These latter repairs can take place during the week while the church is used for weekend Masses. What follows in 2016 is the replacement of the worn out asphalt shingles on the church and repairs for whatever surprises are revealed. Remember folks, our church is the oldest catholic church in Regina and the second oldest building in the city. She deserves our stewardship NOW!
