

Church Floor & Bell Tower Underpinning Project: This week contractor's poured cement for five (5) new piles in the 1931 basement section, as well as hydro-vac two new piles in basement kitchen/conference room area. The process of lowering and leveling the floor in the 1905 basement section is progressing. The building is responding to all but one of the new adjustable floor/roof columns. Several columns have been lowered, however the floor beam requires a full day and night before it settles down into place. The floor beam over one of the new adjustable columns has only moved down 1/8 inch during the last week. This same beam is required to be lowered by 2 inches to its final resting place.

This week, the BBK Structural Engineers also delivered their revised pile design to underpin the four (4) very large transept floor/roof columns. Each transept pad is engineered to support 50,000 lbs of weight. The underpinning process must lower each transept pad downward and at the same time install new piles to stabilize the existing pad and column.

The Papal Bull announcing the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy

From Francis, Bishop of Rome: To all who read this letter I send the blessing of grace, mercy, & peace.

22. Let me now speak a little about indulgences because a Jubilee year always involves granting them. Simply put, God indulges us. This Holy Year of Mercy is time during which, by taking certain steps under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, we will come to know firsthand this indulgent God. Not only are our sins forgiven but we are transformed as children of God. We are transformed; and this is what the indulgence of the Holy Year offers us.



So when we visit a shrine, celebrate Reconciliation, tend to the poor, or make peace with someone, we receive an indulgence from God. Likewise, we live within the communion of saints and their holiness leads us to holiness.

Therefore, we approach the Father’s mercy with absolute assurance that his mercy extends to our entire lives. To “gain an indulgence” is to experience this holiness in the Church.

23. As we ponder the meaning of mercy this year, we do so as neighbors to Jews and Muslims. Both of these great traditions consider mercy to be one of God’s most important attributes. Both are steeped in understanding God as mercy and kindness. I hope that during this Jubilee we can encounter these and other great religious traditions and dialogue with them.

24. We turn now to Mary, the Mother of Mercy. May she watch over us in this Jubilee year. She witnessed the mercy of her son, Jesus, throughout his life and even at the foot of his cross. In her great hymn, Mary sang in this or similar words: “God’s mercy flows in wave after wave on those who are in awe before him...” During this year, let us pray to Mary in the great Salve Regina, known in English as the Hail, Holy Queen.

We pray with those in the communion of saints who made divine mercy their mission. In particular, we honor St Faustina Kowalska. May she stand with us before God throughout this year.

Annual Joint Prayer Service of Reconciliation

In the Anglican-Roman Catholic Covenant signed in 2011 between the Diocese of Qu'Appelle and the Archdiocese of Regina, the two dioceses commit to holding an annual joint prayer service of reconciliation with the participation of both bishops. This year, the service will take place on Pentecost Sunday, May 15, at 7:30 p.m. at St. Paul's Cathedral, Regina.
