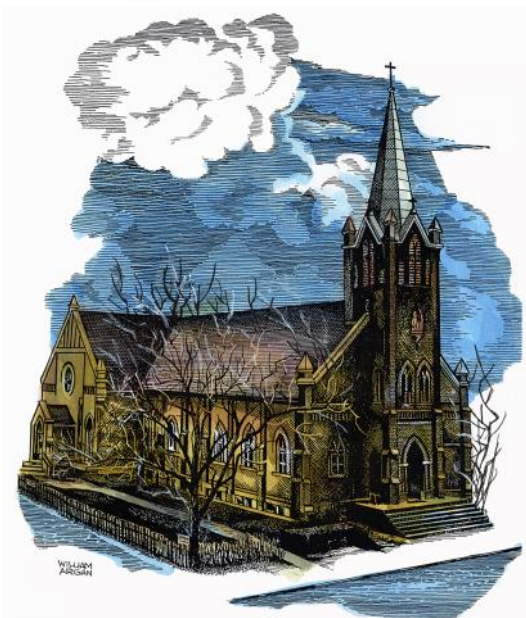

Blessed Sacrament Parish Accounting

Blessed Sacrament Parish has for many years employed a Business Manager/Accountant to manage its financial records, Diocesan financial reporting, Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) reporting and payroll. A mostly manual paper based accounting system was used until 2008. Then second-generation computer accounting software began to be used with spreadsheets, as well as residual manual accounting processes for payroll and bank reconciliation. The part time parish business manager/accountant did most of this work in his home.

On April 21, 2010 Archbishop Daniel J. Bohan promulgated a decree that each parish is to have a finance council as prescribed by Canon 527 as a rule for the Universal Church. This decree also required each parish finance council to comply with the Archdiocese of Regina Parish Finance Council Guidelines. Even so, Blessed Sacrament continued to operate without a parish finance council until the fall of 2013, when the pastor Fr. Lorne Crozon asked four parishioners to become finance council members. This marked a significant step toward transparency and accountability in the parish.

In 2014 Blessed Sacrament's finance council decided to begin the transition to move the parish accounting and the management of its financial books into the parish office. Many of the larger parishes in the diocese had already made this move with the parish office manager doing the data entry and parish accountant overseeing the books and doing the financial reporting. In June 2014, the SAGE 50 accounting software was purchased and installed on the parish office computer. In January 2015, the office manager began data entry, while the payroll and bank reconciliation remained as manual paper processes. In January 2016, the Archdiocese Finance Officer provided support to transition from a cumbersome SAGE 50 Journal Entry process to the modern SAGE 50 invoicing and payroll processes. Needless to say, these accounting transitions have been challenging. The last transition step involves the reporting processes to the diocese, the CRA and the South Saskatchewan Community Foundation (SSCF) who require a formal audit report.

The Chartered Professional Accountants (CPA) Institute of Canada in 2014 legislated new licensing requirements, standards, qualifications and Rules of Professional Conduct for CPA firms or members that provide professional accounting services. A transitional licensing period began in November 9, 2014 and applies to CPA services requiring assurance engagements, audits and reviews, and any certificate or declaration regarding financial reporting and accounting standards. The transitional licensing period for Canadian institutions ends in October 31, 2017.

In view of the above, beginning in June 2017 Blessed Sacrament Parish is contracting out its accounting oversight and reporting processes to a licenced CPA firm. The day to day accounting data entry, payroll, bank reconciliation and reporting processes will reside only in the parish office. The Archdiocese of Regina Financial Officer requires us to tender a Request For Quote to several CPA firms who are licensed to perform audits which comply with the CPA Institute of Canada. Our Parish Finance Council will review the quotes and select a qualified auditor to meet our requirements and those of the SSCF. The formal audit report will be printed and distributed when available, as well as openly published on our parish website to ensure accounting integrity and transparency. We will be among the first in our Archdiocese to implement this standard of scrutiny and accountability.

I and the Finance Council look forward to this last implementation which will ensure transparency and accountability for all of Blessed Sacrament's treasure.
