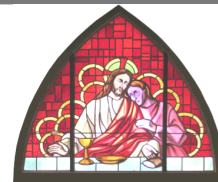

• **Face Masks are recommended to be worn as much as possible**, and are required to be worn when approaching the priest or Eucharistic minister for communion, while joining in any singing, when moving around the church, or in any situation where social distancing is not possible.

• **Social Distancing** is required at all times.

• **Cleaning and Disinfecting** is done immediately before each Mass, and so the doors of the Church open only 30 minutes before each Mass.

Church Visitation: You may visit the Church for prayer each day after weekday Masses, Monday to Friday, until 3 PM.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: Wednesday, Thursday and Friday after Mass, until 1:30 PM (*or while two or more are available for adoration*).

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Confessions will be available Monday through Friday before Mass, 11:30-11:50 AM; Saturdays, 4:30-4:50 PM.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms will be celebrated on Sundays periodically after the morning Mass. Please contact Father Jim directly at his email address for further information if you wish to celebrate this sacrament.

Sacrament of the Sick: The anointing of the sick will be available Tuesday, October 27th & November 3rd, at the end of the midday Mass. The sacrament may also be requested by calling the parish office.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

After the midday 12:05 PM Mass on:

- Tuesday, October 27th
- Tuesday, November 3rd

"Is anyone among you sick? Let him call the presbyters of the Church and let them pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord" (James 5:14-15).

This Sacrament of the Sick is open to all who have health problems due to illness or age, or have impending surgery. Through the Sacrament of Anointing, the Church supports the sick and the elderly in their struggle against illness and continues Christ's work of healing. The Sacrament expresses the sharing that each one of us has in the suffering of others. Even if you have participated in the celebration of the Anointing of the Sick in the past, we welcome you to join us. Those receiving the Sacrament also find comfort in the communal prayer and personal presence of all who attend this celebration. The sacrament may also be requested at any time by calling the parish office.

Saskatchewan Provincial Election – The organization Catholic Conscience - is working with Catholic dioceses across the province to offer information and resources during the Saskatchewan provincial election. The Catholic Action campaign is a non-partisan voter education initiative, centered on educating Catholic voters about Catholic social teaching and how that teaching relates to relevant political issues; along with mobilizing the Catholic community to get out and vote. The first Catholic Action campaign was held during the 2019 federal election, and included a range of resource materials such as “Conscience Cards,” one-page briefs on themes of Catholic social teaching and its relation to relevant election issues, and party platform comparisons from the perspective of Catholic teaching. TF214: How to Vote Like A Catholic - Part 2 Q&A with Dr. Brett Salkeld

The theme of this Sunday’s readings is love. Jesus reminds us that the most important duty of a Christian is to love the Lord with our whole self and to also love our neighbor as our self.
