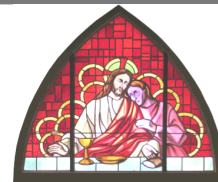

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

- **New SHA Health Order** was announced increasing certain COVID-19 restrictions including mandatory use of non-medical masks in all indoor public spaces in Regina. This includes those attending the celebration of the Mass, entering the parish office and attending any other parish gatherings.
 - **All persons attending Masses** (including other events or meetings) at Blessed Sacrament Church **are required to wear face masks** from the time they enter our church until they have exited the church.
 - **For communion**, people should leave their mask on when they come forward, receive communion in the hand, step to the side, slip the mask up (down, or to the side), consume the host, replace the mask and continue back to the pew.
 - **Arrive** before the start of Mass so that everyone is seated and properly social-distanced before Mass.
 - **Cleaning and Disinfecting** is done immediately before each Mass, and so the doors of the Church open only 30 minutes before each Mass.
- Church Visitation:** after weekday Masses, Monday to Friday, until 2 PM.
- Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament:** Wednesday, Thursday and Friday after Mass, until 1:00 PM.

Plenary Indulgences for the deceased faithful in the current pandemic

In a special decree, issued on October 22, the Apostolic Penitentiary has said that “this year, in the current circumstances due to the “Covid-19” pandemic, the Plenary Indulgences for deceased faithful will be extended throughout the entire month of November, with adaptation of works and conditions to guarantee the safety of the faithful.”

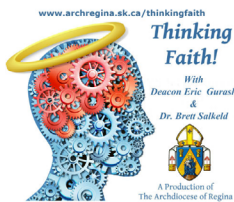
This includes changes to indulgences provided for private prayer for the deceased in a church and for visitation of a cemetery to pray for the deceased. In the case of private prayer in a church, individuals unable to attend a church at this time due to illness or other pandemic-related factors, may do so within their own homes as well. Both of these pious practices may be transferred to any other day of an individual’s choosing throughout the month of November.

These are what are known as ‘structures of sin’ and what structures of sin do is that they make it hard to be good and make it easy to be bad...”

We may long to hear the Lord say to us, “Well done, good and faithful servant,” as the Lord does with the first two servants mentioned in the Parable of the Talents in today’s Gospel from Matthew. However, although the third servant did not squander or waste the gifts (talents) he had received, the Master’s reaction was not the same.

Stewardship is an active way of life. There is nothing passive about it. The Lord expects us to do things, to take the gifts we receive and to share them and multiply them, as was the case with the first two servants cited in the parable.

If we really wish to hear the Lord say, “Well done, good and faithful servant” to us when we are finally judged, we need to do something to earn that praise. The key word in that sentence is “do.” There is nothing abstract about being ready for Jesus’ return and judgment of us. God has gifted us in a multitude of ways. We need to recognize those gifts; acknowledge those gifts; be grateful for those gifts; and most of all use those gifts to benefit the Church and others.

What have we done with our time, our money, and our abilities? In our Church we recognize and point to sins of omission - that is, things we did not do, but should have. Like the first two servants in the parable, it is not just a case of preserving what God has given us; it is a case of using it, increasing it, and returning it to the Lord.

Our support to the Archbishop’s Appeal is our hand multiplied and extended in service to others in spreading the good news of salvation through the pastoral ministries this supports when our physical presence is not possible. The Appeal is a channel to take the gifts we receive and to share them and multiply them, as was the case in the first two servants cited in the parable.
