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CARDINAL CZERNY:  
 THE CHURCH IS SYNODAL  
 IN ITS VERY ESSENCE AND LIFE

Looking ahead to the October 2023 Synod of Bishops on the theme, “for a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission”, Canadian Cardinal Czerny (who is the Under-Secretary for the Migrants and Refugees Section of the Vatican Congregation for Promoting Integral Human Development) points out that it is the opportunity to “to pull the previous steps together into an ongoing process, turning the word ‘Church’ into verbs: encountering, repairing, functioning, serving, praying.”

“Synodality refers to the very essence of the Church, her constitutive reality, and is thus oriented towards evangelization. It is an ecclesial way of being and a prophetic way of serving today’s world,” he explained, adding that Pope Francis’ vision for the Church is “not like a landscape, much less a portrait; rather it is more like unfolding and converging paths.”

The Cardinal concluded his speech with some questions to inspire discussions concerning the challenges ahead, inspired by the realization that “the Church is synodal in its very essence and life” and “the synodal path does not end, as the experience in the Amazon vividly shows.”

The Church exists in many shapes and forms, from the family to the local parish, through to the diocese, associations, movements and organizations, the bishops’ conferences and the See of Peter, he said. “All of them need processes of listening, cooperation and synergy” so that “regulated by humility and docility

We often allow our egos to rule us to try and position ourselves ahead of others. We want to be in positions of power, and many of us do not handle power well. Many people who find themselves in a position of power over others use this power to bully and belittle those who are answerable to them. They have not learned that true power comes from empowering others. Jesus tells his disciples that in order "to become great among us, you must be your servant." Servant leadership is very powerful not only for the leader but for all those associated with that leader. There is an expression that should always be kept in mind, "If the choice is between being right and being kind; always choose kind."

He studied at the prestigious Al-Azhar University in Cairo and the Graduate Theological Foundation in Indiana, where he earned a Ph.D. in Islamic Studies. In these days of increased social polarization and intolerance, where racism, antisemitism, and Islamophobia appear to be increasing daily, dialogue between faith communities is an antidote to ignorance and hatred. ## Spiritual Motherhood of Priests Apostolate for the Archdiocese of Regina

The idea of spiritual adoption of priests, where a woman adopts a certain priest as her spiritual "son" for whom she promises to pray, is not a new one; however, it was reserved only for nuns. In 2007, the Congregation of the Clergy, with the approval of Pope Benedict XVI, invited lay women to adopt priests as their spiritual sons, and to pray for them constantly, particularly before the Blessed Sacrament. In this Spiritual Motherhood of Priests, we try to imitate our Blessed Mother Mary, the first Mother of Priests, in her humility and sacrifice. We adopt priests as our sons with the commitments of Eucharistic Adoration, daily prayers, and sacrifices to help our priest-sons give themselves to God more perfectly in being shepherds of their flocks, leading us all to heaven with them.
