HOLY FATHER ON TODAY'S READINGS

5TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Marked by physical suffering and by spiritual wretchedness, the crowd comprises, so to speak, “the living environment” in which Jesus’s mission, made up of healing and comforting words and actions, takes place. Jesus did not come to bring salvation in a laboratory; he did not preach from a laboratory, detached from people. He was in the midst of the crowd! In the midst of the people! To think that the greater part of Jesus’s public life took place on the streets, among the people, to preach the Gospel, to heal physical and spiritual wounds.
