HOLY FATHER ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

Today, the word "service" appears a bit hackneyed, worn out by use. But it has a precise and concrete meaning in the Gospel. To serve is not a courteous expression: it means to act like Jesus, who, summing up his life in a few words, said he had come "not to be served, but to serve" (Mk 10:45). This is what the Lord said. Therefore, if we want to follow Jesus, we must follow the path he himself traced out, the path of service. (...) Jesus embraces those children and says that those who welcome a little one, a child, welcome him (cf. v. 37). The ones who are to be served above all are: those in need of receiving who cannot give anything in return. To serve those who need to receive and cannot give anything in return. In welcoming those on the margins, the neglected, we welcome Jesus because He is there. And in the little one, in the poor person we serve, we also receive God's tender embrace. (...) Let us ask ourselves: Am I, who follow Jesus, interested in the one who is neglected? (...) And, concretely: do I dedicate time to a "little one", to a person who has no means to pay me back? Am I concerned about someone who cannot give me anything in return, or only with my relatives and friends?

Readers

AT MASS, the reader proclaims the assigned Scriptures that precede the Gospel. A person does not need to be an ordained deacon or priest to serve as a reader at Mass.

The reader joins the Entrance Procession with other ministers. If there is no deacon, the reader carries the *Book of the Gospels*.

Readers exercise their ministry at the ambo. After the Opening Prayer or Collect, a reader moves to the ambo for the First Reading. If there is no cantor, the reader may recite or sing the Psalm. This responsorial comes from the Scriptures and may be considered a reading like the others. If there is a Second Reading, another reader may proclaim it. After the homily, especially if there is no deacon, the reader may announce the intercessions. The entire ministry of the reader takes place during the Liturgy of the Word.

A good reader prepares for this ministry. Readers study the assigned Scripture in anticipation of the Mass. They strive to understand its meaning and the reason it was chosen for this celebration. They pray over the words and let themselves be formed by what they read.

A good reader becomes familiar with the whole Bible. The Scriptures become a part of the reader's daily and weekly prayer.

The ministry of a reader is most effective when the reader has a devout spirit and the skills of interpretation and proclamation. This ministry takes on deeper significance when readers live their lives in conformity with the word they proclaim.

The proclamation of the reading will become a more living interaction if the members of the assembly do not read the text along with but pay full attention to the reader as a person.

Stewardship Bulletin Bit

"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Mark 9:35

Jesus teaches us that we are called to love one another. Love involves sacrifice. Sacrifice is a word that many of us don't like to hear. We think it means that we must give up something that we want. However, the literal meaning of sacrifice is "to make holy," from the words "sacer" = sacred and "facere" = to make. In other words, when we sacrifice, we make our lives holy by sharing our gifts in the service of God.

Opportunities for **Stewardship of Time and Talent** at Blessed Sacrament Parish



Altar Servers - This ministry assists the priest or during our Liturgical celebrations. This ministry is active both on weekdays and weekends and is open to all parishioners.

Eucharistic Minister - Members of this ministry distribute Communion at our Eucharistic celebrations. For those who are able, this ministry also involves taking Communion to the sick of our parish. Participation is scheduled on a rotating basis.

Hospitality - The work of this ministry is primarily to greet those who gather for our Liturgical Celebrations. Members endeavour to make our Church environment hospitable, friendly, warm and safe for the worshiping faithful. Membership is open to anyone who is confirmed. Participation is scheduled on a rotating basis.

Lectors/Readers - In this ministry members are called on to proclaim God's Word to the assembly. Personal prayer and reflection on the Word form an integral part of the preparation for this important ministry. Participation is scheduled on a rotating basis.

Choir or Cantor - The choir leads the congregational singing at our weekend masses, funerals, etc. Practices are held weekly. Membership is open to all parishioners, musicians, especially needed.

Parish Finance Committee - The Finance Committee works with the parish priest regarding the administration and financial affairs of the parish. The Committee utilized the expertise of parish members to prepare an annual budget, oversee the parish financial books and records, and prepare reports for the parish and the diocese. It assists in setting policies and procedures and in planning all financial matters. Membership is by appointment by the pastor

Parish Pastoral Council - This Council advises the pastor in planning, encouraging, guiding and directing all aspects of parish life. It is a consultative body made up of representatives of the parish. The Council defines the parish needs, proposes policies and continuously evaluates on the life and ministries of the parish. Membership is appointed by the pastor.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults - RCIA is the year long process which leads an adult person towards Baptism or full communion with the Catholic Church. The RCIA Team is a group of parishioners who have made a commitment to accompany potential converts on their faith journey. Please contact the pastor directly if interested in serving on this pastoral team.

Knights of Columbus - The Knights of Columbus is a Catholic family fraternal organization. Members of our Parish are welcome to join either of the Knights of Columbus Councils in each Parish. Inquiries may be made through our Parish Office.
